Limited Return Engagement of QED by Peter Parnell Completes Lantern Theater Company's 2014/15 Season Barrymore Award-Winner Peter DeLaurier Reprises Role of Richard Feynman

PHILADELPHIA – Lantern Theater Company announces the addition of *QED* by **Peter Parnell** to its 2014/15 mainstage season, completing a line-up that also includes **Tom Stoppard**'s theatrical masterpiece *Arcadia*, **John Patrick Shanley**'s Pulitzer and Tony Award-winning *Doubt: A Parable*, **William Shakespeare**'s classic comedy of the sexes *The Taming of the Shrew*, and **Steven Canny** and **John Nicholson**'s inventive and brilliantly farcical adaptation of **Sir Arthur Conan Doyle**'s *The Hound of the Baskervilles*.

On stage **November 20 – December 14, 2014**, *QED* is inspired by the writings of Richard Feynman and Ralph Leighton's *Tuva or Bust!* Richard Feynman was one of the most curious and colorful personalities of the 20th century. To his students, he was a beloved professor, Nobel Prize-winning physicist, flirt, and unforgettable inspiration. Tom Stoppard's masterpiece is one of the greatest plays of the last 20 years – a tale of two centuries, shifting as seamlessly between eras as it does between farcical comedy and heartbreaking romance. It is 1809 and young Thomasina is working on geometry and poetry, while her tutor Septimus is working on her mother. It is also the present day, and Hannah and Bernard are scholars and sleuths trying to rediscover the events we see unfold in Thomasina's world. This comedy of misunderstandings and misinterpretations is set up against a passionate quest to unravel the mysteries of history, art, science, and love.

It's *Shrew* as you have never seen it before – the battle of the sexes becomes a tango in which Kate and Petruchio must face the music and dance...literally. Their courtship is both captivating and combative, but the question remains: who is going to lead?
