# Lantern Theater Company Opens 2025/26 Season with THE REAL THING by Tom Stoppard, Directed by Peter DeLaurier, September 4 – October 5, 2025

PHILADELPHIA (August 25, 2025) – <u>Lantern Theater Company</u> opens its 2025/26 season with <u>The Real</u> <u>Thing</u>, the company's seventh production of **Tom Stoppard**'s work. Longtime Lantern collaborator **Peter DeLaurier** directs a cast of Lantern veterans, including **Trevor William Fayle**, **J Hernandez**, **Adam Howard**, **Campbell O'Hare**, **Cheyenne Parks**, and **Brett Ashley Robinson**. *The Real Thing* runs **Thursday**, **September 4 through Sunday**, **October 5, 2025**, at St. Stephen's Theater in Center City Philadelphia; a complete schedule of performances and audience enrichment events is included in the fact sheet below. In *The Real Thing*, playwright Henry is married to Charlotte, who is also the leading lady in his newest play. In Henry's play, her character is married to Max. Max's real-life wife, Annie, is having an affair with Henry. On top of that, the couples are friends. This tangled web of love and performance continues off-stage, as Henry and Annie seek to hide their affair. Once it comes to light, Henry and Annie begin a relationship in the open. But honesty proves just as challenging as performance, as Henry discovers he was not the only one lying in his first marriage. He also suspects Annie of romantic involvement with both an imprisoned activist she works to free (she isn't) and another actor she works with (she is). *The Real Thing* explores romance, suspicion, honesty, and uncertainty – and the ability of the writer to capture the vagaries of the human heart.

"The Real Thing is a delightfully engaging comedy and a huge play, sliding through levels of reality and asking big questions about intimate human relations, language, life, and love," said director **Peter DeLaurier**. "I'm so glad to be exploring this territory with Lantern's great staff and a cast and team of marvelously talented artists."

## About the Playwright

Tom Stoppard has long been a favorite of the Lantern and our audiences, and *The Real Thing* is the seventh of his plays to be produced on our stage: *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern Are Dead* appeared in the company's third season (1996/97), followed by *Rough Crossing* (1998/99), *Heroes* (2012/13), *Arcadia* (2014/15), *Hapgood* (2018/19, also directed by Peter DeLaurier), and *Travesties* in 2023/24. Though he is one of the UK's most celebrated playwrights, Tom Stoppard was born Tomáš Straussler in Czechoslovakia in 1937, just before World War II. His family fled Europe for Asia, where his father died. When Stoppard was eight-years-old, his widowed mother married Englishman Kenneth Stoppard, and they moved from India to the UK, giving the young boy a new home, a new country, and a new name. In his early career, Stoppard worked as a reporter and a theater critic before turning to writing plays for both the stage and the radio. Beginning with his breakout hit, *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern Are Dead*, Stoppard has been a prolific writer, consistently offering plays with beating hearts beneath their dizzying intellect like his most recent play, the deeply personal *Leopoldstadt*. His wildly varied plays take inspiration from British spy novels and quantum physics, chaos theory and Romanticism, Soviet-era politics, Shakespeare, and much more.

## **About the Lantern Artists**

The Real Thing will be directed by longtime Lantern artistic collaborator **Peter DeLaurier**, whose recent directing credits include Lantern productions of Faith Healer by Brian Friel, A Man for All Seasons by Robert Bolt, the filmed production of Molly Sweeney by Brian Friel, Hapgood by Tom Stoppard, Red Velvet by Lolita Chakrabarti, 36 Views by Naomi Iizuka, and The Island and Sizwe Bansi Is Dead, by Athol Fugard, John Kani, and Winston Ntshona. Celebrating 57 years in professional theater in 2025, DeLaurier has also appeared on the Lantern stage in The Plague, The Tempest, An Iliad, Underneath the Lintel, QED, The Train Driver, Emma, Heroes, Uncle Vanya, and Skylight. DeLaurier is a seven-time Barrymore Award nominee, receiving the award twice: for his role as The Librarian in Underneath the Lintel at the Lantern and as Kent in King Lear at People's Light, where he has been a resident company member since 1991.

The Real Thing's cast includes **Trevor William Fayle** as Billy (Lantern credits include Much Ado About Nothing, The Lifespan of a Fact, and Hapgood), **J Hernandez** as Henry (Much Ado About Nothing, The Comedy of Errors, and Romeo and Juliet), **Adam Howard** as Max/Brodie (The Wanderers), **Campbell O'Hare** as Annie (The Comedy of Errors, Tartuffe, and Travesties), **Cheyenne Parks** as Debbie (Much Ado About Nothing), and **Brett Ashley Robinson** as Charlotte (Crumbs from the Table of Joy).

The creative team for The Real Thing includes scenic designer **James F. Pyne, Jr.** (Lantern credits include *The Comedy of Errors, Twelfth Night*, and *A Man for All Seasons*), costume designer **Kelly Myers** (*The Wanderers, The Comedy of Errors, Tartuffe*), lighting designer **Lily Fossner** (*Faith Healer, A Man for All Seasons, Hapgood*), and sound designer **Christopher Colucci** (43nd Lantern production, including *Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol, The 39 Steps, The Comedy of Errors*, and *Faith Healer*). Lantern Education & Artistic Associate **Talia Speak** will serve as assistant director, alongside Stage Manager **Lyndsey Connolly.** 

## **About Lantern Theater Company**

Founded in 1994 and now in its 32nd season, Lantern Theater Company's mission is to produce plays that investigate and illuminate what is essential in the human spirit and the spirit of the times. The Lantern serves the Greater Philadelphia region with award-winning productions and education programming, notably partnering with middle schools and high schools in the Philadelphia School District to provide in-classroom residencies in support of curricular learning. The Lantern became a national leader in streaming theater during the Covid health crisis, producing ten fully designed plays that were created and filmed in the company's resident home at St. Stephen's Theater, garnering coverage in national media including *The New York Times* and *The Wall Street Journal*, and reaching more than 30,000 people in 15 countries and all 50 states.

Following The Real Thing, Lantern Theater Company's 2025/26 season continues with *Macbeth*, William Shakespeare's tragic masterpiece of love and ambition gone wrong, directed by Charles McMahon and appearing on the Lantern stage for the first time and (Press Opening: Wednesday, November 5, 2025, at 7 p.m.); the Philadelphia premiere of *Blues for an Alabama Sky*, Pearl Cleage's mesmerizing and inventive drama of the Harlem Renaissance, directed by Brett Ashley Robinson (Press Opening: Wednesday, February 18, 2026, at 7 p.m.); and the Philadelphia premiere of *Franklinland*, Lloyd Suh's new play about Benjamin Franklin, directed by Charles McMahon and just in time to celebrate our nation's 250th birthday in 2026 (Press Opening: Wednesday, May 13, 2026, at 7 p.m.).
