**Lantern Theater Company Extends Tom Stoppard's *Heroes*, starring Peter DeLaurier, Dan Kern and Mal Whyte, through June 16 – Five Performances Added**

PHILADELPHIA – Lantern Theater Company's Philadelphia premiere of Tom Stoppard's *Heroes* will be extended an additional week through **Sunday, June 16** to accommodate audience demand—the fifth consecutive production of the 2012/13 season to be extended. In *Heroes*, war heroes Gustave (**Dan Kern**), Philippe (**Mal Whyte**) and Henri (**Peter DeLaurier**) are plotting an escape. They've had enough of the tortures of their confinement: dictatorial captors, untrustworthy fellow prisoners, and far too many birthday parties. Indeed, life in a retired soldiers' home is almost unbearable! So, while keeping each other company on the back patio, they hatch a plan to escape to Indochina, or at least to a picnic under the poplars on a nearby hill. Winner of London's prestigious Olivier Award for Best New Comedy, Tom Stoppard's adaptation of this French play is playful, bawdy, and heartbreakingly funny.
