Lantern Theater Company Receives Grant From Forman Family Fund In Support of ILLUMINATION

Lantern Theater Company is pleased to announce it has received a \$15,000 grant from the Nessa Forman, David Forman, Eleanor and Solomon Forman Family Fund of The Philadelphia Foundation in support of *Illumination*, the Lantern's education outreach program.

Lantern Theater Company established *Illumination* in 2003 to educate and to engage local underserved students using dramatic texts and theatrical techniques. From the outset, the goal was to enhance and augment the work of their regular classroom teachers by focusing on improving the students' critical thinking and analytical skills as well as giving them opportunities for creative expression. *Illumination* operates in three vital ways: outreach in area schools, matinee performances for area students, and after-school programs.

This grant will support the Lantern's curricular-focused outreach residencies in Philadelphia schools. Through continuing partnerships with local teachers, the Lantern provides multiple units of in-school residencies, creating customized curriculums providing lessons designed to build the students' creative expression, self-confidence, and comprehension of assigned material and vocabulary. Rather than solely focusing on theater appreciation, the Lantern's innovative residencies take existing curricular materials from local English classes and use the tools and techniques of the theatrical form to enhance student understanding and appreciation of the assigned material.

The target student populations of *Illumination* are high school students from the Philadelphia neighborhoods of Center City, Olney, North Philadelphia, South Philadelphia, Germantown, and West Philadelphia. According to statistics provided by the City of Philadelphia, 70% of the Lantern's residency students are economically disadvantaged, including students at the Lantern's current year-round residency partners: Parkway Center City High School, the Academy at

Palumbo, and the W.B. Saul High School of Agricultural Sciences. During the 2015/16 season the Lantern plans to reach approximately 800 local underserved students through curricular residencies at these three partner schools alone, and expects to serve more than 3,000 students overall through *Illumination*.

The Nessa Forman, David Forman, Eleanor and Solomon Forman Family Fund, a Designated Fund of The Philadelphia Foundation, supports Southeastern Pennsylvania nonprofits serving young people aged 11 to 18 offering inschool or out-of-school-time programs that address one of the following areas: Photography; Architectural Drawing and Architecture; and Written Arts. The Fund was established through the estate of Nessa R. Forman, former V.P. for Corporate Communications and Public Affairs at WHYY and former Arts and Leisure Editor of the Philadelphia Bulletin. She was a passionate advocate for arts education.

The Lantern is one of six organizations to be awarded a grant from the Fund. The other recipients in the Written Arts category include ArtWell's "We the Poets" program, Mighty Writers' "The Mighty Academy" Program, and Philadelphia Young Playwrights' "Paula Vogel Mentors Project." The grant recipients underwent a competitive application process, with screening by a committee that included representatives of The Philadelphia Foundation, the William Penn Foundation, the Barra Foundation and alumni of YOUTHadelphia, the youth philanthropy committee of The Philadelphia Foundation.
