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Lantern Theater Company Presents World Premiere Production OSCAR WILDE: FROM THE DEPTHS

Lantern Theater Company will present the world premiere of *Oscar Wilde: From The Depths*, written by Lantern's Artistic Director **Charles McMahon** and directed by Lantern's Education Director **M. Craig Getting**, from **January 14** – **February 14**, **2016**.

Inspired by Wilde's own "De Profundis," a letter he wrote to his lover from his prison cell, this new play pries open the imagination of Oscar Wilde, the most original and artistic mind of his generation. At the height of his literary success and incandescent celebrity he is brought to sudden and catastrophic ruin. Now, desolate and alone in his cell at Reading Gaol, he struggles to overcome the darkness that threatens to engulf him. Conjuring up a cast of characters from his memory, he revisits the stories from his meteoric career and unconventional personal life in search of transformation and salvation.

Having been interested for some time in Oscar Wilde and the fascinating trajectory he took in his life and his career, the Lantern's Artistic Director felt strongly that he wanted to craft an original piece to be both an exploration of the history of this character and relevant to some of the broader issues in society today. McMahon states: "Wilde was in prison for private behavior, and while that seems insane to us, there are still arguments about civil rights - women's rights, gay rights, the right to privacy - here and now. That's not entirely what the play is about, but it's something that has persisted and becomes clear in any story about Wilde."

This production is not only a project of personal interest to McMahon as a playwright, but it is also an important part of the Lantern's commitment to developing new work. According to McMahon: "Developing new work is the critical next step in the Lantern's artistic growth, enabling us to develop complex creative projects and to better control our own artistic destiny. We see generating new work as essential for giving full expression to the creative passions of the Lantern's key theater artists. Committing to telling new stories in inventive ways will also require us to seek out new

creative voices - playwrights, actors, designers - and set them loose on our stage." The Lantern's 2013/14 season saw the first production of the Lantern's new works initiative: *A Child's Christmas in Wales*, the Barrymore Award-winning world premiere original adaptation of Dylan Thomas' poem of the same name. *Oscar Wilde: From the Depths* represents the Lantern's second world premiere production, and the theater is currently in discussion with several playwrights regarding commissioning new works for upcoming seasons.

ABOUT THE CAST AND PRODUCTION TEAM

Directing this world premiere is M. Craig Getting, also the Lantern's Education Director. Getting's previous Lantern mainstage directing credits include *QED* (2014), *Heroes* (2013) and *A Skull in Connemara* (2011). "Wilde's writing was iconic, singular – just like the man himself," says Getting. "What's most exciting about *From the Depths* is the opportunity to give Wilde's voice new life – and to do it in a setting quite different from where we're used to encountering him. This is also a chance to work more closely with Charles, who has been such a great mentor to me since I joined the Lantern, and I look forward to wrestling with the deep themes of beauty, identity, and redemption that this world premiere explores."

Marc LeVasseur (Oscar Wilde) makes his Lantern debut playing the title role. LeVasseur hails from Astoria, NY and has performed previously in the Philadelphia area at People's Light in their productions of *Arthur and the Red Dragon: A Musical Panto* and *Pride and Prejudice*. Jered McLenigan (Lord Alfred Douglas/Ensemble) returns to the Lantern following his Barrymore Award-winning performance of Marc Antony in *Julius Caesar* in the 2013/14 season. McLenigan has also appeared in Lantern's productions of *The Lady from the Sea* (2005), *The Taming of the Shrew* (2007); *Henry IV, Part 1* (2010) and *A Skull in Connemara*. David Bardeen (Robbie Ross/Ensemble) most recently appeared at the Lantern in *Taming of the Shrew* (2015), and previously in *Henry V* (2013) and *New Jerusalem* (2012 and 2011).

The Lantern's Technical Director Lance Kniskern (*Taming of the Shrew*, *Doubt*) will design the set. Costumes will be designed by Millie Hiibel (*QED*, *Uncle Vanya*). Lantern veterans Christopher Colucci (*Hound of the Baskervilles*, *Doubt*) and Shon Causer (*Photograph 51, Taming of the Shrew*) will design sound and lights, respectively.

Playwright Charles McMahon is the co-founder and Artistic Director of the Lantern. He has directed all but one of the company's Shakespeare productions over the past 20 years, beginning with *All's Well That Ends Well* in the 1996/97 season. He has been nominated twice for the Barrymore Award for Excellence in Theatre for Outstanding Direction of a Play: in 2006 for *Richard III* and in 2004 for *The Comedy of Errors*. McMahon also directed the Lantern's best-selling production of *New Jerusalem: The Interrogation of Baruch de Spinoza at Talmud Torah Congregation: Amsterdam, July 27, 1656* by David Ives, and he acted in many of the company's early productions, including *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern Are Dead* by Tom Stoppard, *Copenhagen* by Michael Frayn and *Waiting for Godot* by Samuel Beckett. In the 2006/07 season, McMahon directed the world premiere of his new translation of *La Ronde* by Arthur Schnitzler, and in 2014 he co-created the world premiere adaptation of the Dylan Thomas poem *A Child's Christmas in Wales* which went on to receive five Barrymore Award nominations including one for Outstanding New Play/Musical. *Oscar Wilde: From the Depths* represents McMahon's first foray into penning an original full-length play for production.
