Lantern Theater Company Announces 2018/19 Season

25th Anniversary Season Features a Mix of Classics and New Work, Including a Commissioned World Premiere Musical, Two Philadelphia Premieres, a Modern Classic Drama, and the Lantern's Annual Shakespeare Production

PHILADELPHIA (February 22, 2018) – Lantern Theater Company announces its upcoming 2018/19 mainstage season, which will include an ambitious and eclectic mix of classical, contemporary, and new work for the stage. The five plays that comprise the company's 2018/19 season include the Philadelphia premiere of *Hapgood*, Tom Stoppard's fascinating and fast-paced tale of Russian spies and nuclear physics at the height of the Cold War; the Philadelphia premiere of David Ives' poetic farce, *The Heir Apparent*; *Betrayal* by Harold Pinter, a sophisticated drama about love, sex, marriage, and friendship; William Shakespeare's dark comedy *Measure for Measure*; and *Minors*, a world premiere musical by Philadelphia artists Kittson O'Neill and Tony Award-winner Robert Kaplowitz. This new Lantern-commissioned work represents the company's first foray into musical theater and is inspired by the notorious "kids for cash" scandal in which corrupt judges sentenced youths to for-profit juvenile detention centers in Luzerne County, Pennsylvania.

"Great stories, great writers, great language. For our 2018/19 season we have selected five plays that are artistically ambitious and characterized by the complex and satisfying storytelling that has become the Lantern's trademark," said Lantern Artistic Director **Charles McMahon**. "With works by Tom Stoppard, David Ives, Harold Pinter, and William Shakespeare, the Lantern will bring to life great stories by great writers, while also introducing an important new piece by two highly talented Philadelphia-based theater artists."

"The Lantern's upcoming 25th anniversary will punctuate a period of tremendous growth," said Lantern Executive Director **Stacy Maria Dutton**. "We vowed to produce a season as artistically bold as our audience has come to expect. Our theater is intimate but our plays are about big ideas." The heart wants what the heart wants, and so we tell each other – and ourselves – the lies needed to get it. This sophisticated drama is a devastatingly honest exploration of love, sex, marriage, and friendship. Told backwards from the end to the beginning, Harold Pinter's narrative masterpiece has spawned many imitators since its 1978 London premiere.

MEASURE FOR MEASURE By William Shakespeare Directed by Charles McMahon March 14 – April 21, 2019 Opening Night: Wednesday, March 20, 2019 at 7 p.m.

When the power of the State is put in the service of one man's lust, Shakespeare creates one of his greatest heroines to combat the abuse. Isabella's courage and brilliance are called upon to fight back against power, corruption, and sexual blackmail. This major play in the Bard's canon will surprise and move modern audiences with its timely insights into human motivation and resilience.

A World Premiere Musical By Kittson O'Neill and Robert Kaplowitz May 23 – June 30, 2019 **Opening Night: Wednesday, May 29, 2019 at 7 p.m.**

Inspired by the "kids for cash" scandal in Luzerne County in the early 2000s, this compelling new work of musical theater gives voice to the families who fought back against a corrupt political machine that turned children into commodities. An intimate American roots rock drama, *Minors* is the inaugural work of Kittson O'Neill and Tony Award-winning composer and sound designer Robert Kaplowitz. *Commissioned and developed through Lantern Theater Company's New Works Program.*

Founded in 1994, Lantern Theater Company launched its current 2017/18 season with a record number of subscribers and a growing community of theater artists engaged in its productions and audience enrichment events. The Lantern's innovative **Theater Artist Fair Pay Initiative** was featured in *American Theatre* magazine as a leading national success story for increasing artist compensation through a combination of fundraising and higher ticket sales. The Lantern seeks to be a vibrant, contributing member of its community, exposing audiences to great theater, inviting participation in dialogue and discussion, engaging audience members on artistic and social issues, and employing theatrical language and techniques to enrich learning in the classroom. Since the inception of the Barrymore Awards for Excellence in Theatre in 1995, the Lantern has been recognized with 96 nominations and 19 awards, including the 2009 Barrymore Award for Excellence in Theatre Education and Community Service. The Lantern's 2017/18 season continues with *The Tempest* by William Shakespeare and the Philadelphia premiere of *Don't Dress for Dinner* by Marc Camoletti and adapted by Robin Hawdon.
