Lantern Theater Company Announces 2019/20 Season

Upcoming Season Features a Mix of Classics and New Work, Including a World Premiere Adaptation, Two Philadelphia Premieres, a Classic Drama, the Lantern's Annual Shakespeare Production, and the Return of a New Holiday Tradition

PHILADELPHIA (February 21, 2019; updated August 1, 2019) – Lantern Theater Company announces its upcoming 2019/20 season, which will include an ambitious and eclectic mix of classic, contemporary, and new work for the stage. The five plays that comprise the company's mainstage season include Bertolt Brecht's *The Resistible Rise of Arturo Ui*, a brilliant drama about politics and fear that remains an insightful parable today; the Philadelphia premiere of Anna Zieger's *The Last Match*, a funny and moving drama from the author of the Lantern's smash hit *Photograph 51*; the Philadelphia premiere of *The Vertical Hour* by renowned British playwright David Hare, a sophisticated drama about the shifting alliances of family; William Shakespeare's tragedy *Othello*; and a world premiere adaptation of Molière's *The Misanthrope*. This new adaptation by revered Philadelphia theater artist Peter DeLaurier will enthrall audiences as the action moves to modern-day Washington, D.C.

"The five plays that make up our 2019/20 mainstage season are stories of the lifelong passions that drive us: passion for power, for truth, for excellence, for love," said Lantern Artistic Director **Charles McMahon**. "Great stories by great playwrights. William Shakespeare, Molière, and Bertolt Brecht give us timeless tales of love, ambition, and deception, and the damage we do to one another in the pursuit of these. We are also proud to bring the important modern voices of Anna Zeigler and David Hare back to Philadelphia for two local premieres, and a season of great plays for interesting times."

The Lantern will also present a remount of its original adaptation of *Charles Dickens' A Christmas Carol*, a new holiday tradition co-created by Philadelphia theater artists **Anthony Lawton**, **Christopher Colucci**, and **Thom Weaver**.

The Lantern's innovative **Theater Artist Fair Pay Initiative** was featured in *American Theatre* magazine as a leading national success story for increasing artist compensation through a combination of fundraising and higher ticket sales. The Lantern seeks to be a vibrant and contributing member of its community, exposing audiences to great theater, inviting participation in dialogue and discussion, engaging audience members on artistic and social issues, and employing theatrical language and techniques to enrich learning in the classroom. Since the inception of the Barrymore Awards for Excellence in Theatre in 1995, the Lantern has been recognized with 100 nominations and 19 awards, including the 2009 Award for Excellence in Theatre Education and Community Service.
